The report covered:

Burglary, vehicle crime and burglary in non-residential properties offences are down significantly this is due to a number of the prolific offenders in the area being in custody at the moment.

Op Stay safe conducted targeting recent ASB in the Park and Princess Street – “On the evening of the 4th November 2016 Macclesfield LPU officers in partnership with other partners including Cheshire East Council and fire carried out a StaySafe Operation in Congleton. The areas targeted were Congleton Park and Princess Street area. These areas have historically had ASB and crime issues. Recently there have been escalating concerns and incidents.

This operation was aimed at educating young people and their parents about the risks they face being out and to provide support and guidance to young people and their parents. Local officers provided a visible presence in Congleton, speaking to young people and subsequently parents.

Some young people subsequently attended Visyon, a local youth building where partners from Cheshire East Youth Engagement Services, Youth Support, EDT, ASB teams, Children’s Services, family support workers and fire were able to engage with the young people, discussing risks and educating them about safeguarding. This was followed up with parents as well.

Overall a total of 20 yellow card/ ASB referrals were completed- parents of the young people were contacted and 1 young person was collected by his mother after concerns raised by officers. “

REPORT TITLE	Treo Memorial		
Background	<p>Steven Ashton contacted the Town Council on 19th January 2017 to say that he had now raised sufficient funds to commission the art work for the memorial of Treo. This is a £15k project. He is looking for reassurance from the Town Council that we would be able to accept the statute and that a suitable and prominent position would be found for the statute in the town.</p> <p>Treo worked with the army and saved many lives. The dog received the highest order for animal bravery. His owner and the dog were local to Congleton. Treo died on the 24/10/2015.</p> <p>On the 26th November the Finance and Policy Committee considered a</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A request to consider providing a memorial to Treo, a dog used by the Army who received an animal V.C, was considered.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">FAP/40/1516 RESOLVED that the request be supported in principle, but should be incorporated in some way into the work being carried out by the Cenotaph Restoration Group.</p> <p>The Cenotaph Restoration Group work has stalled due to lack of grants. Mr Ashton has raised the funds himself and would now like to gift the statute to the town. It is likely to be ready in the next three months.</p> <p>The purpose of this paper is</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Check that Members are happy to receive the statute as a gift2. To seek members opinions on the suggested location and get approval to apply for the necessary planning permission so that the statute can be installed.		
Updates	<p>The cost of the statute and installation work is £15k. This has been raised by Steve Ashton.</p> <p>The proposed location for the statute would in the vicinity of the Cenotaph/ Community Garden/Eardley Statute. The best location would appear to be on the Cenotaph side of the Community Garden, balancing the Eardley statue. This area is currently clear apart from a Rowan tree. (see appendix A)</p> <p>This Community Garden is owned by Cheshire East Council and the Town Council has 123 years of a 125 year lease on the land. Cheshire East Council Planning has confirmed that planning approval would be needed before the statue could be installed.</p>		
Decision Requested	<p>Recommend that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The Town Council inform Steve Ashton that we will be delighted to accept the gift of a statute of Treo2. Authorise officers to explore further the suitability of the space at the front left of the Community Garden (opposite side to the Eardley Statute) and if suitable to submit the necessary planning application.

The tree in question may be dedicated to someone, but the plaque is no-longer readable. This needs to be explored and options considered. Trying to get an update on this before the committee.

REPORT TITLE	St Peters Church Grounds Maintenance Update		
Background	<p>Due to the church yard being a closed burial ground the local Council has a duty to help out with the grounds maintenance. Where a Church of England churchyard is closed to further burials in accordance with an Order in Council under the Burial Act 1853, responsibility for maintenance may at the request of the Church be transferred to the relevant local authority.</p> <p>The transfer is compulsory, not dependent on the condition of the churchyard in question, and not dependent on the local authority's ability to meet the additional maintenance costs.</p>		
Updates	<p>Historically the maintenance work has been done by the probationary service, however back in September 2016 they gave notice to stop carrying out any works at this site.</p> <p>As part of our recently introduced winter programme of works the Streetscape maintenance team have, over the past few weeks been in the church grounds carrying out necessary winter maintenance work on the, path ways, trees and hedges, the end result is a vast improvement.</p> <p>We have received some positive comments from David J Aston Parish Administrator comments below (23.1.2017)</p> <p>"The older Victorian part of the cemetery is looking so much better since you cleared some trees and cut others back/up, great to be able to see through it (and in a sense more secure - no hiding places). Good Job"</p> <p>We are in continuous communication through email and site meetings with the Church Wardens regarding works we are doing and works they would like to see done in the future.</p> <p>Please see images of the improvements that have taken place since work commenced and also a list of both works completed and pending.</p> <p>Works pending</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Hedge on the right as you head to the cemetery from brick building (water area) – cut back a lot is over the graves• 4 section grass area mow / strim paths• Remove moss on the flat graves around church building• Dead wood remove from holly tree in church grounds• Removal of a separate dead holly tree church grounds• Remove self-set tree border of cock shoots path and railings• Ivy on wall of cock shoots path remove• Ivy on railings which divide church and house• Stump grind out trunks left by rear church wall• Remove dead branch in middle of wild area

Background	<p>Congleton Paddling Pool, located in Park Road, is a very well used facility and enjoyed by lots of young children throughout the summer months. The current anti-slip foot path around the edge of the paddling pool is very slippery, especially when wet. It was installed in 2008-9 and is now in a poor state of repair and has even lifted in places so could be a tripping hazard to children. The Town Council is responsible for the Paddling Pool. In the past a thorough clean with chemicals has helped preserve the special surfacing on the path, but an inspection of the path has revealed it now needs replacing.</p> <p>The Town Council spent £16,667 resurfacing the path in 2008-09 (quote from original work attached in appendix one)</p>		
Updates	<p>The Facilities and Development Manager has contacted the following companies to quote for the works.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Novaplay2. Playdale3. RTC safety surface specialists4. Soft surface ltd <p>If the Environment, Services and Amenities approve the need for the work to be carried out, then costings and a recommendation will be made to the Finance & Policy Committee on the 16th of Feb 2017.</p>		
Decision Requested	<p>Would like the Council to approve the resurfacing once the quotes have been received, and to plan the works in before the paddling pool season starts.</p> <p><u>Recommendation</u></p> <p>Approve the need to replace the footpath on safety grounds.</p>

Background	<p>Currently there is no connecting road between the Greenfield Farm and Radnor Park Industrial estates. When Congleton Link Road is opened, it is understood that heavy goods vehicles will be barred from using the residential part of Back Lane and so HGVs will not be able to access Greenfield Farm via the Link Road and will still have to get in and out via Holmes Chapel Road.</p>		
Next steps	<p>To enable this to be achieved we need to work with Cheshire East Council to establish what their current proposals are and if necessary work with them to find solutions to this issue. What is most likely to be required is an adopted road between Greenfield Road and an existing adopted road on Radnor Park.</p>		
Proposal	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. To formally request from Cheshire East Council their plans to restrict heavy goods vehicles using the residential part of Back Lane2. If required, work with Cheshire East Council to develop plans to create a link from Greenfield Road to Radnor Park Industrial Estate suitable for HGV's

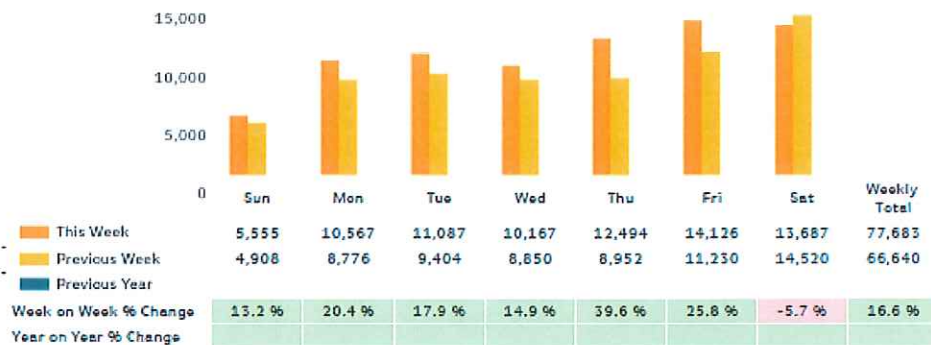

REPORT TITLE	Big Data for Small User – update report		
Background	<p>Congleton is one of seven towns working with Manchester Metropolitan University, Cardiff University, Springboard, Institute of Place Management and other professional bodies on a two year Innovate UK funded project called Big Data for Small Users #BDSU. Appendix two has more details</p> <p>The project started in August 2016. As part of this project a footfall camera has been installed in the pedestrian area. This records the number of human adult size shapes passing a certain point. Recording is 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The Town Centre and Marketing Manager receives a weekly report showing hourly breakdown of movement. The camera has been in operation since the 14th November. (appendix one shows a graph of weekly movement and headline figures since the camera was installed) The report also includes details about the weather and any activities taking place.</p> <p>In addition a number of shops and eateries in town are submitting weekly sales figures so that a picture can emerge of the correlation between footfall and sales.</p> <p>Further into the project there will be an opportunity to obtain some funding to trial some marketing activities and assess the impact that these have on footfall and sales. There will also be an opportunity to compare year on year figures.</p> <p>Congleton Town Council is a partner member in the project. It is being financed through Innovate UK.</p>		
Next steps	<p>We are currently in the early stages of gaining data. The Town Centre and Marketing Manager will be attending a meeting in Birmingham on the 28th February for a national update on the programme and to learn more about the next phase.</p>

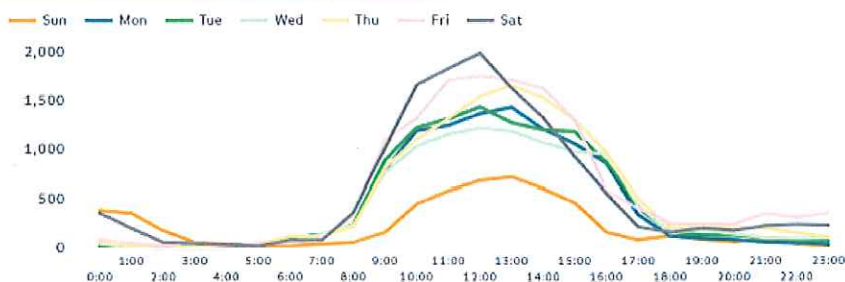


Graph showing footfall in Congleton on an hourly basis – 18th – 24th December
