Changes to Beartown Bus Network?

From Monday 15 April, bakerbus is relaunching its Beartown Bus Network. Once again Bromley Farm will benefit from its own dedicated Beartown bus service, (90), and the Saturday services 93 will serve West Heath and service 76 will operate independently.

Service 95 will continue to serve Congleton Retail Park, Tesco's and Lower Heath, hourly Monday to Saturday. Service 99 will remain part of the **Beartown Bus Network** serving Buglawton, Congleton Railway Station and Congleton Road, Mossley.



Beartown buses will also provide direct journeys between Mossley, Bromley and Congleton High School and between Mossley and Eaton Bank School.

Phil Baker, Managing Director said: "Beartown Bus Network remains a wholly commercial venture by **bakerbus**. We thank all our customers for their support. We have made these changes in the light of experience and changes in demand in Congleton since last August."

There will be some changes to early morning and evening journeys and a few, that were little used, will no longer operate. Please check individual journey times. Fares within Congleton are the same on all our bus services and the bakerbus 10% discount card applies. Copies of Beartown bus timetables will be distributed door to door to households along the bus routes.

Improved Route to Town from Buglawton

There is a new, improved path from Eaton Bank Industrial Estate into Congleton Park, creating a more pleasant walk or cycle into town from Buglawton. Overgrowth has been cleared, the path widened and tarmacked, new gates, some fencing and lighting added. This is the phase three of the River Dane Walkway which is being promoted by Congleton Partnership and Congleton Town Council. Phase one was the new path from Aldi to the Pavilion Bridge in the park. Phase 2 has been half completed and takes the route from Dane Mill to Town Bridge at the bottom of Rood Hill.

Another **SPLASHING SUMMER!**

Congleton's Paddling Pool, in Park Road will open on Saturday 25 May until Sunday 8th September. The opening times will be 10 - 6pm daily, with the Town Council having the discretion to close the pool on cold, wet days.

Generations of children have enjoyed the Paddling Pool since the 1930s, and it's an asset that Congleton Town Councillors have continued to protect for the town.

The Paddling Pool is designed for children aged 11 and under. A member of staff will



be present, but all children must be accompanied by a responsible adult. Car parking on the roads surrounding the Pool is time-limited and restrictive and the Daneside Theatre car park is private, so users are advised to walk, cycle, travel on the bus or park in the Town Centre car parks.



Parklive Congleton is an exciting new event planned to take place in Congleton Park on Friday 12th and Saturday 13th July. On the Friday night there will be a number of local bands playing on Hankinson's Field plus a masquerade ball in the Pavilion. Saturday 13th sees a full day of free daytime activities in the park from 10am - 5pm including Circus Sensible, music, street art, stalls and exhibitions.
