Market Street Toilets Refurbished

Works on refurbishing the Market Street public toilets was completed before Christmas. The toilets were inherited by the Town Council from Cheshire East Council without budget in 2014 when the Streetscape service was devolved to Congleton. At the time, Congleton had the option to close or take on the toilets. The Town Council has spent £12,850 refurbishing the male, female and disabled toilets to make them fit for purpose. The Town Council is also looking at extending the opening hours until 5.30pm rather than closing at 4pm.

Congleton's Share of Council Tax 2017/18

Congleton Town Council is mainly funded through a 'precept', which is a tax added to the Community Tax which is collected by Cheshire East. Other income is raised through sponsorship, hiring out the Town Hall and specific grants. The Town Council has an ambitious programme enhancement and community leadership which has meant its capacity, skill levels and costs have increased. From April next year the Town Council has increased its precept by 1.77% (just over one pence a week on an average band D property). The Town Council is responsible for running Streetscape services, the Town Hall, the Paddling Pool, part funds four PCSOs, pays for CCTV to be monitored for the town, supports the Citizens Advice Bureau, Congleton Partnership and Congleton Community Projects as well numerous other projects and campaigns focusing on enhancing the quality of life in Congleton.

2017-A year of Improvements for Congleton

2017 promises to be a year when the town sees actions taking place on some much talked about projects. Although these works may cause some short-term pain, the long term benefits will be good for the town.

GAS WORKS

National Grid in partnership with Balfour Beattie started to replace the old gas pipes in the town centre in January. The first phase is expected to last until late February and involves replacing the gas pipes in the pedestrian area. The second phase will replace the gas pipes in Swan Bank and is expected to take about six weeks.

PUBLIC REALM

Work is progressing on the planned improvements for the pedestrian area. Finalised plans should be ready to share soon with works scheduled for later this year.

LEISURE CENTRE

Cheshire East Council is in the process of appointing a 'development partner' for the redevelopment of the leisure centre. The intention is to take a number of bidders to the next stage where outline proposals for the leisure centre will be submitted. This procurement process is anticipated to conclude by the end of April 2017 when the team will make recommendations to the Council's Cabinet to formally appoint the successful bidder and commence the redevelopment of the leisure centre which will include a new swimming pool.

SCARBOROUGH 'MILLS' DEVELOPMENT

Scarborough Development has been developing more detailed plans for the proposed 45,000sqft retail and leisure 'Mills' development in Mill Street and the current market area. The plans will be shared with interested parties ahead of being formally submitted as a planning application in the next few months.

Congleton Old Saw Mill

St. Peter's Church

St. Peter's Church, Chapel Street, has received initial support of £203,700 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for the Key to the Future project. Following the successful replacement of the roof and repairs to the tower, this new phase of the project aims to carry out essential repairs to the centre section of the eighteenth century plaster ceiling, its cornices and decorative features. The church had been the

town's chapel for almost four hundred years before it became an independent parish in the nineteenth century. Most of the present building dates from 1742 and is the town's only grade 1 listed building. It is still in regular use for worship, civic services and other public events. Development funding of £15,200 has also been awarded to help St. Peter's progress their plans to apply for a full grant at a later date.

Consieton Unplugged 2017

Break free of those winter blues with Congleton Unplugged! Whilst it is cold, wet and windy outside, it will be warm, dry and friendly on the inside with the very best of Congleton's acoustic music, with over 30 gigs and 10 venues, including; Folk, Celtic, Classical, Jazz, Pop, Blues, Choral. The action takes place in venues across Congleton on the 3rd - 5th
