Need The Police?



Residents and visitors should call 101 for non-emergency issues such as minor traffic collisions, damage or if they want to speak to a local Police Officer or PCSO about

affecting their community.

When calling 101, the system will determine your location and play a recorded message announcing the police force you're being connected to. Each call only costs 15p no matter what time of day it is or how long the call lasts. This means anyone calling the police knows exactly how much a call will cost them, whether they're calling from a landline or a mobile phone.

People should continue to call 999 in an emergency - when a crime is in progress, there is danger to life or violence is being used or threatened.

Congleton Community Credit Union

Congleton Community Credit Union is a local savings and loan co-operative, which has been in existence for more than 18 years. The organisation is run by a board of unpaid elected volunteer directors. Members save what they can afford and can borrow up to 3 times the amount they have saved. Repayments are planned within your budget so there are no risks of you being over stretched and getting into a spiral of debt. All profits come back to members in an annual dividend.

Some members join to be part of a great community initiative while others use it as a vital lifeline to help ends meet. The collection point is staffed by volunteers on a Saturday morning between 10-11am on the ground floor of Congleton library. the Town Hall on 14 September and Grand Final Hair and Fashion Show on 9 November.


