# Congleton Celebrates The Diamond Jubilee



veryone is invited to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee 'Loverlee Jubilee' event in Congleton Park on Monday 4th June from 1pm - 6pm. There will be childrens' entertainment, brass bands, live music, art activities, displays and much more. Bring a picnic, wear something red, white or blue and come and join in the fun.

## **Congleton to Welcome Olympic Torch**



The World's media will be watching Congleton as we welcome the Olympic Torch relay through our town on Thursday 31 May. The relay will begin at 8.55am by the 'Welcome to Congleton' sign on the Sandbach Road near Congleton High School.

The relay will then pass along Sandbach Road, West Road, Clayton By-pass, Rood Hill and finish at the National Speed Limit sign on the Macclesfield Road near Eaton Bank School at around 9.30am. The route will be closed to traffic for up to an hour before the relay starts to ensure the safety of the crowds. The roads will be re-opened as soon as it is safe to do so.

Congleton Town Council, Congleton Community Projects and Team Congleton are helping to coordinate activities along the route. Creative workshops are being organised to make decorations and flags. ## **NEW DEFIBRILLATOR IN TOWN**

A defibrillator is a life-saving machine that gives the heart an electric shock in some cases of cardiac arrest. Weatherspoons Counting House, on Swan bank, is the latest place in town to host a defibrillator machine. Staff recently completed a training course and with the pub open from 8am - late it is seen as a useful location to house a machine. Defibrillator

machines can also be found at Boots. Morrisons and the Tourist Information Centre in the Town Hall, West Heath and High Town Pharmacies, Tesco, Congleton Leisure Centre and Congleton and Astbury Golf Clubs. With every minute that passes the chances of survival decreases by 14% so being aware of where defibrillators are really can save lives.



The Congleton First Responders are offering local people the chance to register for FREE Heart Start basic life



support training. The 21/2 hour course will give participants the skills and confidence to deal with a wide range of medical emergencies, including a cardiac arrest, heart attack, un-conscious patient and choking. People of all ages and ability are welcome and no medical experience is necessary. Training is provided by qualified British Heart Foundation Heart Start instructors, in a very relaxed and informal atmosphere.

## **Eco**Schools

Congleton & District can now boast 8 schools with one (Mossley, Astbury and Quinta) or two (Marlfields, St Mary's, Smallwood, Daven, Black Firs) prestigious Green Flags from Eco-Schools, which is an international award programme that guides schools on their sustainable journey, providing a framework to help embed these principles into the heart of school life. Two more schools (Scholar Green and Bosley St Mary's) are awaiting their green flag assessment in the next few weeks.

Patti Pinto, the eco schools representative for Congleton Sustainability Group, says the aim is for all 16 schools to achieve Green Flag status by December 2012. Patti runs an eco cluster with termly meetings when eco coordinators can meet and share ideas and best practice. In addition Patti has ensured that, by March 2012, all 16 schools reached the gold level for Wildlife Friendly Gardens awarded by Cheshire Wildlife Trust. This means they have at least 12 features (habitats, planting and maintenance) within the school grounds to encourage wildlife.

Several of Congleton's eco schools have registered with the RHS Campaign for school gardening, with Marlfields now at level 5 (celebrating with the wider community) and St Mary's at level 4 (sharing best practice).

## **Adventure Assault Extension Built**

An £80,000 Adventure Assault Course is awaiting residents who like a physical challenge at Bromley Farm Recreational Park, Edinburgh Road. Phase two has now been completed, while phase one was opened last year.

The £53,000 extension has been funded through the Community Spaces programme which is being managed by Groundwork UK as an Award Partner to the Big Lottery Fund. Community Spaces is part of the Big Lottery Fund's Changing Spaces Initiative. £50,000 was granted by Community Spaces to be spent on the course and landscaping features. Congleton Town Council and Bromley Farm Community Development Trust provided additional financial resource.



There are numerous challenges including a zip wire, tunnel and mound, slide, skater, wobble beam, wobble bridge, tarzan walk and various climbing frames. There is something to suit any age or ability. So come and give the best play park in the town a try!
