The UK's only Kayathalon?

Astbury Mere Trust, Astbury Sailsports and Cheshire East Council may well have come up with a national first when it hosts a Kayathlon on Sunday 23 May at Astbury Mere. The fun event – which involves running/walking and kayaking, will put the Mere on the map.

There will be races for year groups 7-12 in the morning involving a one mile run (once around the lake) followed by a 200m kayak course. The Open Classes in the early afternoon will involve two laps around the lake (2 miles) and a 600m course. The Elite races have a three mile run and 800m course. (Course lengths are approximate).

Congleton Town Hall A Great Congleton Venue

Since the Town Council took over the Town Hall in June 2008 bookings for the Grand Hall, Bridestones Suite and meeting rooms have increased significantly, but there's still room for your event!

There are three rooms for regular hire the Grand Hall – which is ideal for large parties, receptions, markets, exhibitions, dinner dances, concerts and public meetings. The Hall costs £35 per hour (minimum booking two hours) and £300 on Friday and Saturday nights. Congletonbased charities and voluntary groups can get a 50% discount for the hall on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights – (subject to availability) and a 20% discount on all rooms for daytime bookings.

The Bridestones Suite is undergoing a dramatic transformation from a 1960s court room to a light airy 'mini Grand Hall'. Works are expected to be completed in April. At £25 per hour this will then be the

Make sure nothing stops

The General Elections must be held before 3 June 2010. To vote you must be registered on the electoral role. If you are not registered, you can't vote. To register see www.cheshireeast.gov.uk or call 01270 529570.

Anyone may vote by post instead of going to a polling station. If you would like a postal vote you will need to contact Cheshire East's elections office who will send you an application. The application form needs to be returned to the elections office at least 11 working days before the election - so if you know you want to vote by post apply early and don't wait for the election to be called. If you apply for a postal vote you will not be able to vote in person at the polling station. If you wish to cancel the postal vote you will need to write to the Electoral Services Section at Westfields. Sandbach. You will need to return your postal ballot by election day if your vote is to be counted.

Thanks to a subsidy by Cheshire East Council the popular Beartown Buses will operate a normal service, rather than a Bank Holiday service, in Congleton this Good Friday (2 April). This will make it easier for local people wishing to come

into town to shop or to attend the 'Churches Together' service at 12 noon outside the Royal Bank of Scotland.
