That the part of the pedestrian area should be removed as it is a thoroughfare linking the two main areas of the evening economy - Lawton Street and Swan Bank - and many people under the influence of intoxicating substances pass through this area. That fines should be used as a last resort would prefer to see behaviour courses or community work offered first and fines if the offender does not turn up. The Town Council also wanted to make sure the Scarborough Development, the likely future landlord of the area, had been consulted.

Motion for Community, Environment and Services Committee Meeting 1st February 2018

I wish to draw the Town Council's attention to the parking issues in front of my property in Fenton Close. Myself and several of my neighbours have written to councillors over many years requesting that a no parking sign is erected at the end of our side cut-off of Fenton Close. We have never had a reasonable response. In the last 18 months things have escalated to an intolerable level because of the yellow lines in Cross Lane, the parking restrictions at the shops at Hightown, and the parking charges at the station.

Local residents in Ayrshire Way and Fenton Close are mightily inconvenienced by parking on our estates, but my own particular problem is that I live in the part of Fenton Close that faces Biddulph Road, it has no pavements and has a grass verge on one side. The road is narrow and it is difficult to get on and off our property when people park and then go and get on a train for the day or go across to their businesses at High Town returning after closing in the early evening. Emergency vehicles would not be able to access the bungalows at the bottom of our cul-de-sac and as they are occupied by older people this is not a good situation.

I have written to Councillor Brown on 3 occasions, 2 by email which he ignored and then in hard copy and email. At this time fly 2016, Councillor Brown passed on my hard copy letter to an individual in Cheshire East who replied on a totally different parking issue, that of parking in the main Fenton Close area which is wide and has pavements. He had obviously not bothered to look at a map or the photos I had sent. I replied to both the individual and Councillor Brown in August 2016 stating that this didn't answer my complaint but yet again I have been ignored by both the individual and Councillor Brown.

At the time of writing the grass verge is like a ploughed field, it is difficult getting on and off our drive and when we ask people not to park there we are abused in the ripest of language. In the last year our lives have been made a misery by thoughtless parkers who are not willing to pay to park at the station and business owners who are aggressive and totally indifferent to the rights of the people living here.

It is hard to describe the situation in a letter and the photographs don't really show the problem, what it needs is someone to drive to Fenton Close and have a look at the situation and perhaps even have a conversation? We need a "No Parking Private Road" sign at the top of our cul-de-sac.

Background	At the previous CES Committee meeting on the 9 th November members were made aware that a Cheshire East public consultation was in progress on a Public Space Protection Order for the area around the current market, as well as Victoria Street and part of the pedestrian area. The discussion around the proposed new order led to a number of points being raised by the Town Council which were subsequently submitted to Cheshire East Council as part of the consultation. The consultation ended on the 20 th November. This paper is to update Councillors on the progress of the order.		
Current Position	Cheshire East received 40 comments about the public consultation exercise, the majority of which were in full agreement with the order. Having considered all the comments a slightly revised order is being put forward for the Cheshire East Portfolio Holder to consider and sign off. When writing this paper a date for the new order to be considered by the Cheshire East Portfolio Holder had not been set but is expected shortly. If approved, it is expected that the Public Space Protection Order will be in place for the 1st March 2018. Cheshire East will order all the signage and will arrange publicity surrounding the scheme.

As this scheme has an impact for the community it was suggested that this committee should also be kept informed of progress.		
Current Position	Following the meeting of the 14 th September coverage was given in the Chronicle and information sent out to shops letting know that the Town Council has approved a new scheme and that information packs would be ready in October for anyone interested. 22 shops expressed an interest and were sent out a pack. Two of the shops

REPORT TITLE	700 Mayors Charity Sprint Triathlon- Update		
Background	At the CES Committee meeting on the 9 th November members noted the there was an intention to hold a second Sprint Triathlon and that this was likely to be in April 2018. Since the 9 th November meeting considerable work has gone on behind the scenes on the formula for the next Triathlon. This paper is to update members on that work.		
Current Position	The plan is to hold the 700 Mayors Charity Sprint Triathlon on Sunday 22 nd April.		
	Similar to last year, adults and those over 16 will be involved in a 500m swim, 10km cycle and 5km run/jog/stroll. Numbers of adults taking place will be limited to 48 either individuals or teams. Entry will be £20 per person to cover costs and entrants will be asked to try and raise around £50 as an individual or £100 as a team towards the Town Mayor's Charities. All funds will go through the Town Mayor's Charities. New for 2018 will be the Young People's Go-Tri. This will involve a 150m swim, 6km cycle ride and 3km run/jog. This will take place ahead of the adult event. Time will allow for 5 'waves' of 12 entrants – so a total of 60 teams or individuals will be able to take part. It is anticipated that one wave will be made up of senior school pupils and cadets, three waves will consist of primary schools pupils and co-ordinated through the schools and one wave filled from interested young people. There will be no cost for entry, although some sponsorship will be encouraged. After considerable research into a closed road area for the cycle element of the event, it was decided to use the paths around the park the same as in 2017. The aims of the event are to:		
	 Raise funds for the Town Mayor's nominated charities To improve personal fitness levels and feel good factor for more than 100 local people. To inspire people of all ages to become more active To promote swimming, cycling and running. 		
	In addition to the main triathlon the organisers are looking to work with other sporting groups to promote a range of activities that take place in Congleton plus will be introducing a medieval theme to link with the 700 years of Mayoralty.
