



P ollowing the success of last year's Triathlon, the fun sporting event will return on Sunday 22nd April - and this year even more people can join in!

The Congleton Triathlon is designed as a challenge for groups and individuals who do not usually participate in sport. There are 48 places available and there's a chance to join in pre-event training with other participants. People can enter as an individual or as a team of up to three people with each tackling an element of the triathlon: Adults 500m swim at Congleton Leisure Centre (20 lengths), 10km cycle ride around the park and 5km run in the park. Last year the event raised around £7,000 for East Cheshire Hospice and some of the participants hadn't cycled or

jogged until three months before the event!

A Go-Tri event for 8-15 year olds will be held immediately before the adult event. Most of the 60 team slots will be allocated through schools and clubs. There will also be a number of health and well-being stalls, and some medieval themed activities as part of the 700 years of Congleton Mayoralty. Congleton swimming, cycling and running clubs will be helping out on the day.

The entry fee is £20 per participating adult to cover costs. Entrants are encouraged to raise £50 in sponsorship (or £100 per team) to support the Town Mayor's Charities.

Council Tax

Congleton Town Council is largely funded through a 'precept', which is a tax added to the community tax collected by Cheshire East Council. Additional income is raised through hiring the town hall, sponsorship and specific grants. From April 2018 the Town Council will increase its precept by 2.64%, just over 4p a week on an average band D property. The Town Council is

Mini Bus Hire

Congleton groups in need of transport are reminded that there is a 15-seater and an 8seater minibus that can be used by local groups and organisations in Congleton. To be eligible the group needs to be linked to the Congleton Partnership. Membership can be through association with sub-groups such as Congleton Youth Forum, Congleton Senior Forum, Congleton Creative, Congleton Sustainability Group or the Executive.

The bus costs £20 per event or day to hire plus 40p per mile. Groups using the bus need to provide their own driver. To comply with the insurance, drivers must be aged 30 or over with no more than 3 points on their driving licence.

Neighbourhoood Plan

Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan went through the Regulation 14 consultation from 2nd October to 13th November. A number of residents, developers and statutory groups submitted comments and the various sub groups are now working through those comments and where appropriate suggesting changes to the draft plan. The new draft plan will then be put through a further round of consultation, known as Regulation 15 consultation. Ultimately the plan will be put out to a referendum where Congleton Town electors can either approve or reject the plan. If approved the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan would be part of the planning documents for Congleton and need to be adhered to within future development.

Makers Market to come to Congleton

The work on Congleton's Public Realm is expected to be completed by the end of February 2018. Improvements have included new lighting, blocked paving and new street furniture as well as creating usable space by the Royal Bank of Scotland and more seating at the House to Home end of the pedestrian area. Once the works are complete the Makers Market is looking to hold a regular monthly artisan market in the town centre. Consultation is expected to be held later in January with traders and others to agree on the best day to hold the markets for Congleton. This will either be on a Saturday or a Sunday and it is anticipated that the markets will begin in March.
