Congleton Food & Drink Festival will be celebrating its 10th anniversary on Sunday June 10th. From 10.30am - 4.30pm the town centre will be buzzing with around 120 stalls selling a wonderful range of dedicated local produce. The stall holders will be sharing their passion for their top quality, healthy and mostly locally produced food with the thousands of visitors in town.

Congleton Cycling Campaign group will set up a free bike parking area to encourage cycling to the Festival. The Green Scene supports Congleton Sustainability group, Food4free, Vale allotment produce, the

RSPB, Compassion in World Farming and the Bath House and Physic Garden who will be selling their medicinal herbs. Plus the popular Festival Fringe will have art stalls and activities in Cross Street.

New Look Leisure Centre

The much promised new Leisure Centre for Congleton took a big step forward in March when Cheshire East Council approved funding and a preferred bidder for the £8.8 million project. The centre will remain in the same location and will benefit from a brand new pool hall incorporating a new learner and main pool. There will also be a complete redevelopment and refurbishment of the remaining building, with much improved

fitness and gym facilities. The centre will continue to be run by Everybody Sport and Leisure and the aim is to keep as much of the centre open as possible during the works.

Cheshire East Council will be entering into discussions with the preferred bidder to refine the final design details and agree on a timeframe for the pre-construction stage, prior to applying for planning approvals.



Police Surgeries

A Cenotaph Fit for Congleton

The Congleton Partnership and Congleton Town Council are working on a project to refurbish the Cenotaph site on Lawton Street Congleton. The current site is looking tired, has poor access for anyone with a disability and more crucially close on 250 names of the casualties are not recorded on the plaque. To right this wrong we need to extend the site to include more plaques for the names and at the same time improve accessibility, appearance and general

aesthetics of the area. Plans have been developed with the community and have received planning permission from Cheshire East (Application number 17/3982C). Congleton now has three years to raise the necessary £230,000 to make the project possible. £20,600 is already in the fund. Every amount large and small will help. MAYOR MAKING AND PARADE

This meeting is open to all and is part of a long tradition of Mayors in Congleton. The Mayor's Civic Parade will be held on Sunday 17th June, meeting at the back of the Town Hall at 2.15pm.

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Congleton's Annual Town Meeting will take place on Thursday 26th April from 7pm - 8.30pm. This is not a Council meeting but a meeting for residents where you can have your say on all matters connected to Congleton and is hosted by the Town Mayor. There will be a number of short presentations followed by a chance to ask questions.

PUBLIC SPACE PROTECTION ORDER

A new order has been passed to give Police and Wardens extra powers to tackle anti-social behaviour in the Market area, Princess Street and Victoria Street. New signs will be put up in April and those breaking the order could risk a £100 fine.

Paddling-Pool Time of Year!

Congleton Paddling Pool in Park Road is getting ready to open its gates for the summer season, starting on Saturday 26th May. The town's paddling pool will remain open, weather permitting, from 10am - 6pm daily until early September. Due to concerns over safety, numbers may need to be restricted on the busiest, hottest days. Last year this wasn't necessary. On days where more than 150 people wish to access the pool at the same time two sessions may be introduced and tickets given at the gate to restrict numbers.

Residents are reminded that the pool is designed for primary school aged children



and all children must be accompanied by a responsible adult. Alcohol, smoking/vaping, dogs and cycling are not permitted inside the Paddling Pool area. Users are reminded to be respectful of local residents and to remember that Daneside Theatre Car Park is a private car park and cannot be used for the pool. Town centre car parks are just a short walk from the pool and park.



Jazz & Blues Warm-Up Gig

Congleton Jazz and Blues Festival gets that little bit bigger each year! In 2018 the Town Hall will be joining in as a venue and things are starting early with a warm-up gig featuring some of the festival favourites - Robin Pierce Band, Heidi Browne and Vavoom on Saturday 21st April. Doors open at 7pm for what promises to be a super-dooper packed out night. Tickets are £10 in advance or £12 on the night and are available from the Town Hall Tourist Information Centre and A&A Music. All proceeds will go to the Congleton Jazz and Blues Festival.
