A Call to Remember!

Sunday 11th November, the 100th anniversary of the end of WW1. You can support the parade as it marches from Booth Street taking in West Street, Antrobus Street, Mill Street, the pedestrian area, Market Square and Bank Street before reaching the Cenotaph in Lawton Street. After the two minutes silence at 11am, dignitaries and associations will be called up to lay wreaths.

There will be a 100 year concert in the Town Hall on Friday 9th November, with funds going towards the cenotaph project to get the 250 missing names included onto a renovated area with more carved plaques. The poppy appeal will be launched at the October Makers Market on the 27th October.

CONGLETON POLICE - Working with you!



Some of the best intelligence the local police receive comes from within our own communities. A great deal of evidence and materials are needed to put together a case

for searches or warrants, and the information provided by people living and working in Congleton is vital to help create a full intelligence picture. You can provide information to Cheshire Police in many ways, including anonymously through Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111 or online at www.crimestoppers.co.uk; via 101 (costs 15p per call) or via one of Congleton police surgeries advertised on the Cheshire Police Website supported by local Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs). www.cheshire.police.uk

The PCSOs for wards covered by Congleton Police Station are Jessica Shore, Chris Munro, Georgia Creed, Julia Short and David Bell. Congleton also has six dedicated Beat Management Police Constables - Helen Weeks, Helen Hood, Emma Burns, Kate Ritchie, Ian Bell and Garry Charnock. The Beat Mangement Sergeant is Keith Graham and the Inspector Penny Jones. Messages can be left for any of the officers at Congleton Police Station in Market Square.

Between January and July this year the team dealt with 1219 reported crimes in the Congleton Town Council area. Violence and Sexual Offences, Public Order and Anti-social behaviour were the largest groups of reported crime.

Weeds are a growing problem in towns across the country. Changes in legislation on strengths of weed killers, along with reduced council resources means that if we are going to enjoy weed-free streets, more help is needed from local people. The majority of weeds are in front of houses or businesses. If the occupiers could spend 15 minutes a couple of times a year, many of the weeds could be cleared - providing, of course, that it is safe to do so!

Elizabeth Statue for Congleton



E I i z a b e t h Wolstenholme Elmy was an amazing woman who lived in Congleton for 50 years of her life. She was an activist who fought for equality through marches and speeches and wrote over 1600 petitions and 7000

letters. She worked tirelessly for education for girls, for women's rights to own property and for women's rights to vote. She died in 1918, just after the first women got the right to vote.

Elizabeth was nicknamed the brains of the suffragist movement and is listed on the Millicent Fawcett Statue in Parliament Square in London. In Congleton there is only a blue plaque on her home in Buglawton. Now a local group is working hard to make a statue of Elizabeth a reality for Congleton town centre so she can be remembered and inspire future generations. Raffle tickets to raise funds towards the statue can be purchased from the TIC and other outlets. The raffle will be drawn at the Christmas Lights Switch on.

Shout, Shout Up With Your Song!

See an interactive celebration of the work of Elizabeth Wolstenholme Elmy and the passing of the 1918 Representation of the People Act in Congleton's pedestrian area at 11am and 2pm on Monday 29th October. During these sessions re-enactors 'Act it Out' and will depict those issues which, for over 20 years, had divided the nation and even today have not

been completely resolved. In addition to the re-enactment, local people are encouraged to visit the exhibition on the life and work of Elizabeth at Congleton Museum, which will open especially for this event.
