
Bear News from Congleton Town Council & Community Groups Summer 2019

CONGLETON JAZZ & BLUES

FESTIVAL celebrates its 10th anniversary over the August Bank Holiday weekend – Friday 23rd-Sunday 25th August 2019. Once again, Congleton will come alive with the sound of music in a free festival celebrating all genres of music from cool jazz to blues rock and everything in between. On Friday 23rd August, in association with Blue Funk Rhythm and Blues Club, the European Blues Challenge winner Kyla Brox Band will be playing a ticketed gig in the Town Hall. On Saturday 24th and Sunday 25th there will be more than 60 free entry gigs in 18

venues across the Town Centre, plus a special community stage in the Bath House Physic Garden on the Saturday. The event will start with the traditional umbrella parade leaving the Community Garden at 1.15pm.

Congleton Jazz and Blues Festival is a community-based event, it is an independent not-for-profit organisation run by volunteers to benefit Congleton town centre.

Know Where Your Nearest DEFIB Is!

A new 24/7 defibrillator is to be located in the red telephone box in Padgbury Lane. This new defib has been installed thanks to Congleton Town Council, Congleton Partnership and Congleton Lions. It is one of 29 defibrillators located in Congleton - see www.congleton-tc.gov.uk for full details.


A defibrillator is a device that gives a high energy electric shock to the heart of someone who is in cardiac arrest. It is an essential part of trying to save the life of someone in cardiac arrest. Cardiac arrests can happen to anyone at any time. If you come across someone having a cardiac arrest: Call 999. Start CPR, ask someone to bring a defibrillator (by ringing 999, you can find out your nearest defib and get the access code if located in an outside box), turn on the defibrillator and follow its instructions. Anyone can use a defibrillator and it will only instruct you to deliver a shock if it detects that it is needed. For every minute it takes to find and deliver a defibrillator, the chances of the person surviving reduces by 10%.

After years in the planning, work is about to commence on Congleton's new-look Cenotaph, allowing for the addition of almost 250 names to be recorded at the site. Funds for the £170,000 project have largely been met through local trusts and a large Town Council underwrite. Now local people have

an opportunity to be part of the project. Donating £5 to the project will cover the costs of two letters being carved into the new stone and help ensure that Congleton's fallen heroes will always be remembered. Local people can donate to the project via the Tourist Information Centre, there will also be

an opportunity to record your donation and any comments you wish to make in a Congleton Cenotaph Support Book.

Plans are underway for an official opening of the improved site on Sunday 3rd November. On Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd there will also be an exhibition in the Town Hall.

Improved Play Areas for More Activities

Three of Congleton's 13 play areas have become even more fun places to hang out with improved play-equipment added to make them great places to go this summer. The Quinta Play area, off Ullswater Road, now has nine new pieces of outdoor gym equipment. West Street Play area has been opened-up to make it less hidden as well as having new play equipment added. A new roundabout, slide, climbing trail and football goal has been added to the play area behind Park Lane, accessed via Townsend Road or Thames Drive.

In addition, the town's Paddling Pool will remain open daily from 10am - 6pm until Sunday 8th September (weather dependent). On hot days a 300 people limit will be added, which once reached will lead to a one-in-one-out policy.

Flowers, Photos & Produce on Show in the Town Hall

This year's annual Congleton and District Horticultural Show will take place in the Town Hall on Saturday 7th September. It's a great opportunity to show and view the best flowers, photos, vegetables, cakes, jams and pickles in town! Congleton's Streetscape Services

Congleton Town Council employs a small team of 13 grounds staff to deliver the street cleansing and grounds maintenance duties services devolved from Cheshire East. This team is responsible for litter picking and emptying around 170 public litter bins, many on a daily basis. They also take responsibility grass cutting in specific areas (other areas are covered by Cheshire East Highways, various housing organisations or private contractors), roundabouts, cenotaph, troughs and baskets and other civic spaces plus checking the carried out by the team is on a regular rota with targets to meet. The Town Council tries to maintain some flexibility so that the team can respond to incidents or issues that require urgent attention due to a safety concern. The Town Council's Streetscape team is not responsible for maintaining or improving hedges, shrubs or trees on private land or for removing fly-tipping from private land. Congleton Link Road



A536 Congleton Link Road Scheme

The route for the new link road will run to the north of Congleton, just south of Eaton. It will link the A534 Sandbach Road, near its junction with Sandy Lane, to the A536 Macclesfield Road, near its junction with Moss Lane, and provide a new crossing at the river Dane. It will also create road connections to both the Congleton Business Park and Radnor Park Trading Estate.

Work began on-site in January 2019, since then work is taking place across the scheme including:

- Site clearance
- Fence Erection
- Road improvements along Back Lane
- Archaeological work
- Farth works

- Piling works (Giantswood Lane Overbridge)
- Diversion of existing drains and services
- · Ecology works

The process of monitoring, capturing and relocating the newts to six newly created ecological ponds and habitats is now complete. There has been a noticeable change to the landscape along the route of the project. To mitigate the impact, 16km of hedgerows will be planted, 33 hectares of new grassland, 10 hectares of woodland and shrubs including more than 380 new trees.

The Congleton Link Road scheme is on programme and will be complete late 2020.

Marlfields Primary School Allotment Project

At GRAHAM we aspire to be different and leave a mark on the local community that stands the test of time. One of our recent community engagements has been to help create an allotment at Marlfields Primary School, Congleton. Thane, a pupil at the school helped to design the allotment and GRAHAM are constructing it as per the school's drawings. The school children and local community will maintain and develop the allotment for years to come.



Thane, pictured here, has been working closely with GRAHAM staff to see the plans come to fruition. Works will continue over the coming weeks.

Sandie Isherwood Head Teacher at Marlfields Primary School said: 'The school has held the Eco Green Flag award since 2006, a leading school for others in the town to follow. This year, our pupils had plans to create a school

and community allotment and worked with Patti Pinto's support to create an impressive design. When prices for the allotment were requested, it was obvious it was going to be a long-term project.

We approached Dan Cawthra at GRAHAM, the contractors undertaking the Congleton Link Road, and we have been in total awe of the support they have given the school.

We are well on our way to creating a fantastic resource at the school which will give our pupils and families opportunities to become ecologically aware of how we can sustain the important eco-human balance needed for the future. As our pupils have said, we will not only have a new road from GRAHAM to support our town, but also our fantastic new allotment.'



School Engagement

On Tuesday 30th April, Patsy Murphy and Dan Cawthra from the GRAHAM team were at Black Firs Primary School to talk to the pupils about road safety and the dangers of construction vehicles. GRAHAM's first and foremost priority is safety, with the upcoming summer school holidays we are asking for children and parents to take extra care, especially around the GRAHAM sites and be mindful of the increased number of HGV's and plant equipment on the roads.

Another Chance to Have Your Say on the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan



Congleton Neighbourhood Plan group has agreed to put the Draft Congleton Neighbourhood Plan through more consultation to ensure that the policies contained within it are what local people want and can be enforced in the future. The previous draft edition of the Neighbourhood Plan was consulted on when National Planning Policy Frameworks relied on the 2012 guidance. This was strengthened in 2018, but Congleton's plan couldn't take advantage of the more stringent policies, particularly on sustainable development, as draft plan had to adhere to the policies that

existed at the time. In addition, questions raised by the Examiner when considering the plan, meant some sections needed further clarification.

The intention is to carry out a six week 'Regulation 14' consultation over the summer. This will be followed by a Regulation 15 consultation. The newly consulted plan will then be considered by an Examiner, before going to a referendum. The focus is towards protecting what is special about Congleton. Launch of Elizabeth Fund

Elizabeth's Group, a charity founded to celebrate the achievements of Elizabeth Wolstenholme Elmy, is a year old. Elizabeth was a nationally noted suffragist and activist who lived in Congleton for over 50 years. She was a remarkable woman who played an important role in many of the

country's social and political reforms of the late 19th and early 20th centuries and to whom we still owe much today. Yet she has been largely forgotten locally.

Elizabeth's Group has set out to change that. The Heritage Lottery along with the Margaret Williamson fund has provided money to set up an archive of Elizabeth's important work both locally and on the internet. The Group is also raising funds for a statue of Elizabeth to link Congleton into a Suffragette Heritage trail and attract visitors to the town. New Exhibit at Congleton Museum

A new Roman Hoard of 1,500 coins is now on display at Congleton Museum. The successful partnership between Museum of Liverpool and Congleton Museum which brought both the Knutsford and Malpas Hoards to Congleton has again been successful in ensuring that this new hoard found at Poole near Nantwich will remain in the area. Discovered in April 2016, this







hoard provides a further insight into the distribution of accumulated wealth during the Roman occupation of Cheshire. This exciting new acquisition has been made possible through the Heritage Lottery Funded (HLF), 'Hoards of Cheshire' project. The museum can be found behind the Town Hall and is open Tuesday - Sunday. Entry by donation.
