Are You Ready To Vote?



Congleton residents will have the opportunity to vote for Town Councillors and Cheshire East Councillors on Thursday 2nd May. Everyone over the age of 18 who is registered to vote will have the opportunity to elect up to 10 Town Councillors and three Cheshire East Councillors to serve in their area until 2023. You must be registered by the 12th April in order to vote. You can register at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

Polling cards will be sent through the post around the 26th March. Voters who are

away or may have difficulty getting to a polling station can opt for a postal vote or proxy vote. Polling Stations will be open on the day from 7am - 10pm. Postal votes must be applied for by the 15th April and Proxy vote application (where someone votes on your behalf) by the 24th April. More information from Cheshire East Council tel: 0300 123 5016.

A Cenotaph - Fitting for Congleton

Congleton Cenotaph should be one that Congleton can be proud of by the end of the year. A plan to renovate the area and importantly add the 250 missing names to the 240 currently listed at the site has taken a huge step forward recently thanks to a financial underwrite by Congleton Town Council worth up to £90,000. Visions for upgrading the Cenotaph started in December 2013, when a group of interested local people formed a WW1 education and awareness group. This work has continued and come under the umbrella of the Congleton Partnership.

Applications for National and Regional funding have not been successful, but the project was seen as too important locally to

let it fail. As well as including more than double the amount of names, the new-look site will offer a more user friendly place for local people to pay their respects.

A Year To Tri!

There's still time to get your entries in for this year's Annual Town Mayor's Triathlon which takes place in Congleton Leisure Centre and in Congleton Park on **Sunday 28th April**. A Go-Tri for youngsters starts at 1.30pm. This is free to enter for 8-14 year olds, and applications can be accepted up until the 5th April or until full if earlier. The adult Sprint Triathlon event follows the Go-Tri and is a great opportunity for anyone aged 15+ to challenge themselves. Entries can be individual or as part of the team and involve a 500m swim, 10Km cycle and 5km run or jog. Entries cost £20 if solo or £15 as part of a team to cover the costs of timing chips, medals and food. Adult entrants are encouraged to gain some sponsorship, with funds raised going to the Town Mayor's charities.

It's probably one of the most relaxed and fun Triathlon's around! Last year the average age of those taking part was 50. Training for the Triathlon takes place every Sunday at 1.30pm at Congleton Leisure Centre. Local people are encouraged to come and support on the day.



PCSO Surgeries

Local people have the opportunity to meet with their local PCSOs at drop in surgeries held across the town. At the surgeries the PCSOs will remain in one place for at least an hour and welcome people to come and talk to them about any issues which they think the Police should know about, or to ask any questions. Congleton's three town PCSOs are Jessica Shore, Christopher Munro and Georgia Creed.

- PCSO Jessica Shore covers the Town Centre, Lower Heath, West Heath and holds surgeries at New Life Church Café, Stock at the Pavilion, Tesco's Barn Road and the Old Saw Mill.
- PCSOs Christopher Munro and Georgia Creed cover Bromley Farm, Mossley,

Timbersbrook and Buglawton and hold surgeries at Parnell Square Hub, and McColls in St John's Road.

- As part of the same team, there are three rural PCSOs; PCSO Matthew Steele holds surgeries at Glebe Farm and PCSOs Julia Short and David Bell at Marton Golf Club.

RECLAIM THE PAVEMENTS

The Town Council frequently receives complaints about inconsiderate use of the pavements, including over-grown hedges, parking, dog mess, bins, rubbish and cyclists. The Town Council has to work with other agencies on these matters.

- **Hedges:** Hedges that are part of the highway are cut by Cheshire East or Streetscape. Hedges on private land, even when they creep onto the pavement, are usually the responsibility of the owner or landlord. If they are obstructing the pavement Cheshire East can request that they are cut back or, if necessary, order the work and recharge to the property.
- **Parking on the Pavement:** Where this is causing an obstruction, is on double yellow lines or blocking a dropped pavement the Police can issue a fine.

- **Dog Mess:** Dog walkers are encouraged to pick up after their pets. Street Wardens do cover the Congleton area and will issue Fixed Penalty Notices. You can report problem areas to the Wardens on telephone 0300 123 5021.
- **Bins:** Congleton Town Council empties around 170 public bins and carries out regular litter picks. Street Wardens can issue Fixed Penalty Notices for dropping litter and there are large fines for fly-tipping. Commercial and household waste cannot be placed in the public bins and, if suspected, action will be taken against the offender.
- **Cyclists:** Cyclists have no rights to cycle on pavements. However, very few riders are issued with penalty notices - If you collide with a pedestrian, you could be prosecuted for careless cycling.

Paddling Pool

Congleton's much loved Paddling Pool, in Park Road, is getting ready to re-open for the summer season. The plan is to open the children's pool on the Saturday 25th May, in time for the summer half-term holiday. The town's paddling pool will then remain open, weather permitting, from 10am - 6pm daily until early September.

Residents are reminded that the paddling pool is a facility for children aged 11 and under. All children must be supervised by a responsible adult and alcohol, smoking/vaping, dogs and cycling are not permitted inside the pool area. If we have another hot summer, for safety



reasons, numbers in the pool area will need to be limited to 300, with a one-in one-out entry policy introduced once the maximum number is reached. If driving to the Paddling Pool please use near-by town centre car parks.

HIDDEN THEATRE - 11th May

The Electric Picture House and Congleton Community Projects are organising the Hidden Places Theatre Day on May 11th at their new home in Spindle Mill. The day begins at 1.30pm with a Hidden Talents performance of a show written and produced by young people (under 12) in a series of workshops held at Spindle Mill.
