Congleton's Chance to Bloom in 2020

In 2019, Congleton received its best-ever score from North West in Bloom - a massive 92% - and will now represent the North West in the national finals. By far, the overwhelming strength of the Congleton entry is the community involvement in the project.

60% of the marks are allocated for environmental responsibility and community involvement, and 40% for horticultural excellence. The team believes that its greater focus on sustainable

planting, peat-free compost, allotments, composting and growing our own plants, along with the excellent work of the many 'It's Your Neighbourhoods' and involvement of so many groups and organisations in the town-wide In Bloom community campaign, will give Congleton a great chance in the National finals. 2020 Action for Leisure Centre Refurb

Funding and permissions are in place for the refurbishment of Congleton Leisure Centre and local people should see works start within the next couple of months. As Bear Necessities went to press Cheshire East was finalising the contract so that a definitive timeline of works can be published.

The new centre will have a brand-new swimming pool, much improved changing areas, a modern café and soft play area, state of the art fitness suite over two floors as well as squash courts and sports hall. Every effort is being made to ensure that visitors can safely use the centre while works are being carried out.

During the construction, part of Hankinson's field will be fenced off. This will not prevent continued play by the rugby club, and pedestrians and dog walkers will still be able to gain access to the field and to both bridges leading to the park. For more details see www.cheshireeast.gov.uk

New Business Plan

Congleton Town Council's approved Business Plan for 2020 - 2023 has a focus on climate change and reducing the town's carbon footprint, the importance of making sure that services and infrastructure in Congleton keeps pace with the growth in Congleton's population, as well as working towards reducing economic, social and health inequalities within our community.

Some of the key issues identified include the shortage of social housing, the lack of support for families, the climate emergency, the declining retail market and the need for sustainable transport and more promotion of our town.

Many of the priorities are the responsibility of other agencies such as Cheshire East Council, the NHS or national bodies, but Congleton Town Council has set itself the challenge of working in collaboration with others to drive change.

Town Council's Share of the Precept for 2020/21

Congleton Town Council is largely funded through a precept. This is added to your annual community tax collected by Cheshire East Council. Approximately 5% of your annual bill comes to the Town Council, with the majority going to Cheshire East, Cheshire Police and the Cheshire Fire Service. Additional income is raised through the hire of the Town Hall and specific grants and sponsorship.

From April 2020 the Town Council will increase its precept by 3.6% which makes the Town Council precept for an average band D property £89.31 per year, or £1.71 per week. This is 6p per week more than last year. Time and funding resources will be focussed towards activities which enable the Town Council to achieve the aims and objectives laid out in the 2020-2023 Business Plan.

Climate Change Emergency Focus on Walking and Cycling

Congleton Town Council has declared a Climate Change Emergency. We are looking for residents help and support in reducing carbon use. Walking and cycling for short journeys is an effective way to help reduce carbon emissions, improve air quality and improve personal fitness.

It's good to start young, and this year it would be great if even more young people could cycle and walk to school. Schools can help by producing an active travel plan - with an active travel plan, schools may be eligible for funding for secure cycle parking, lockers for bags and equipment to support cycling to school.

The Town Council's sustainable transport group is keen to hear about the barriers that stop you from walking journeys of less than one mile or cycling journeys of less than two miles. We know that people put bikes in the car to visit the parks or drive to the leisure centre. What needs to be done so that people would choose to cycle or walk to their destination?

An Ambitious Tree-Planting Scheme

Work is commencing on a plan to plant 30,000 trees in and around Congleton over the next five years. A sub-group from Congleton Partnership is proposing to plant trees across Congleton funded by grants from Congleton Partnership, William Dean Trust and Congleton Town Council, as well as many other public donations. The aim is to create a more attractive environment for all; the planting will also improve the overall environmental quality, (including air quality and noise reduction), of the neighbourhoods.

The team leading the project includes a local experienced professional Landscape Architect, Cheshire Wildlife Trust, experts from Cheshire East Council and Congleton Town Council plus a team of knowledgeable volunteers. All tree species will be carefully selected and will be appropriate for the location.

Trees benefit local communities in many ways including the following:

- Absorbing greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide, which in turn helps to combat climate change.
- Offering shade and a cool place for people to enjoy during periods of high temperature.
- Soaking-up rainwater helping to prevent localised flooding.
- Supporting wildlife through providing habitats for feeding and breeding as well as a shelter.
- Reducing noise pollution within the busy environment if they are planted in dense walls, hedges or avenues.

GREEN SPACE

Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Working Group has identified 43 areas which it believes should be protected with a Local Green Space designation in the emerging Congleton Neighbourhood Plan. Local Green Space designation is a way to protect green areas or open spaces against development where they are of particular importance to local communities. The Congleton Neighbourhood Plan can only consider spaces **within** the Congleton Town boundary and not in the adjoining parishes.

The national guidance allows for a wide range of spaces to be included - but they do need to be in reasonably close proximity to the community and proven to be special to a local community and hold a particular local significance eg for its beauty, history, recreational value or richness of its wildlife.

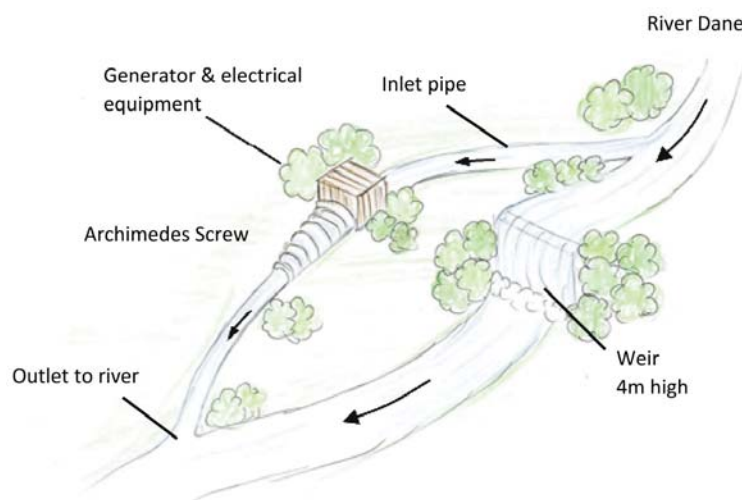
Invest in Congleton's Community Energy Scheme

After nearly four years of detailed work by the Dane Valley Community Energy volunteers the Hydro Project on Havannah Weir is now on a solid road to fruition. Extensive ground investigation works have enabled robust civil design and costings to be completed. It is planned that site work will commence by the middle of the year and electricity being generated late in 2020.

This will only happen if as a community we raise the capital through a Community Share Scheme regulated by the FCA (Financial Conduct Authority).

The Share Prospectus is currently being prepared and will be available later in January, 2020.

Funding for Bright Ideas

Cheshire East Council has introduced two new forms of 'Bright Idea' funds to support not-for-profit organisations and to inspire local people to develop or enhance local projects. Funding is allocated four times a year. The closing dates for applications in 2020 are 27th March, 26th June, 25th September and 18th December.

My Bright Idea Fund

A maximum award of £250. This provides an opportunity for local residents who wish to share skills, interests and passions through volunteering to promote or deliver projects that will improve the health and wellbeing of their community.



Our Community Bright Idea Fund

A maximum award of £10,000.

News In Brief...

WAR MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

The Minor Injuries Unit and the X-ray department at Congleton War Memorial Hospital have been closed since before Christmas due to electrical issues at the hospital. It is hoped that by early Feb the improvements to the system will allow the temporary electrical heaters to be removed, reducing the load on the electric circuits and enabling the X-ray to be operational. The Minor Injuries Unit should then re-open Monday - Friday 10am - 6pm, with the caveat that the NHS Trust can move staff at short notice to cover A&E at Macclesfield. It is always worth checking online that the Unit is open. The Town Council believes that the services provided at the War Memorial are vital for Congleton and the surrounding areas and is lobbying to ensure they continue and become more reliable.

The first town tidy of the year will be held on Saturday 7th March. This will be followed by a town-wide Spring Clean on Saturday 21st March and then Town Tidies on the first Saturday of the month.

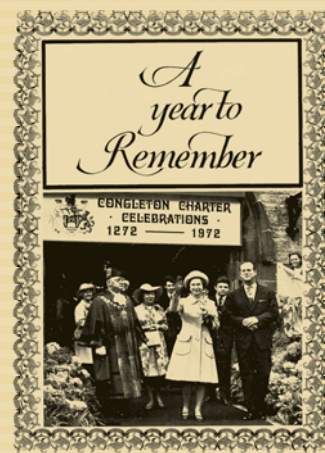
