APPENDIX ONE - Letter from John Saville Crowther to CE Committee

I would like to bring this Committee's attention to the disgusting issue of dog mess on our pavements and public spaces, and to ask for your support in stamping out this revolting practice by ignorant dog owners and walkers.

The other day, I went to collect my child from Congleton High School, as the weather was bad. While I was waiting for my child, there were lots of school children leaving school onto Box Lane towards Sandbach Road. I noticed that some of the children had discovered that they had trodden in dog mess on Box Lane near the traffic lights. I found it rather distressing to see them all wiping their shoes on the grass in the bad weather. As you can appreciate this is unavoidable when children are so distracted by talking to each other instead of watching where they are walking.

Some children may have trodden this into school, walking through the Main Hall to get to their classrooms and at lunch time the Main Hall is used for lunch breaks and some children accidentally drop their lunch on the floor. I am really angry, we shouldn't we have to put up with this disgusting behaviour from so few in our town?

I feel for the parents when the children arrive home, some will just walk straight into their homes not realising they have dog dirt on their shoes.

I would like this Committee to consider this issue and let us know what can be done. I know I am not alone in being appalled by this behaviour, just last week there was a letter in the Chronicle and there have been numerous posts on social media.

Response to letter by John Saville Crowther

Congleton Town Council shares your frustration. It is illegal to fail to clear up after your dog under the Cleaner Neighbourhood and Environment Act 2015 – as well as disgusting and creating an unnecessary hazard.

As a Town Council we run campaigns to encourage people to clear up after their dog. We provide and empty over 160 public bins across the town to make it easier for people to dispose of waste properly. Dog waste can be placed in the ordinary public bins and well as the specific dog-bins. We provide anti-dog fouling posters and spray stencils and can speak to groups and organisations about the issues of dog fouling and help to run localised campaigns. We have installed three dog bag dispensers in the town centre to help reduce the issue of dog walkers who have 'run out of bags'.

Although the Town Council carries out street cleansing work in the area, it is not feasible to attend every call requesting someone comes out to remove a single piece of fouling near their home. In the Box Lane, we have put up signs to help warn the parents and children who attend Congleton High school that there is dog fouling in the area so please take care when walking to and from school.

We also work closely with the Cheshire East Wardens. The wardens have the powers to issue £100 fixed penalty notices to people not clearing up after their dog. If the public are aware of regular offenders they can contact the wardens with times, locations and a description of the dog and owner, and then the wardens can make targeted efforts to carry out enforcement in the area. Streetscape has reported little in the way of Graffiti or needles/drug paraphernalia

Theft from motor vehicles happening all over Congleton – remains a priority. Some try all doors on vehicles along a road. Works vehicles are being broken into. Thefts from high value vehicles for a catalytic converter.

Lots of rubbish along the canal by the station, graffiti, Julia to speak to Probation Service, Glen to speak to the Canal and Rivers Trust.

9. AOB

Street-a -week happening on the 24th February -whole Beat Team – Monday evening Chance for the ASB team to volunteer – Police to send information to the group.

Inspector Kelly Johnstone introduced herself –previously worked in Knutsford and has a good working knowledge of Congleton. Has replaced Inspector Penny Jones, who has retired.

Police have been on a big recruitment drive. 44 new police joined Cheshire in January. More intakes in March, June and November. PCSOs will also be recruited.

Inspector Kelly Johnstone to send contact details to Jackie Mac to circulate to the group.

Chris Williams DCI- carrying out a review around vulnerable people. Lots of efforts put into safeguarding vulnerable young people. More focus also needs to be placed on vulnerable older people. Item 4 - Julie Walker - CEC Connected Communities, Mental Health lead

CHOC (Congleton and Holmes Chapel) — Mental Health lead — advocate for peer support groups. Peer support can help prevent people needing higher levels of care/support. Julie has many years of experience including experience working with bi-polar UK. Very little community peer support mental health groups. Big issue around safeguarding, safe place, appropriateness, confident of health professionals to recommend them.

Connected Communities putting a member of staff from the Old Saw Mill on two days Mental Health first aid training.

Julie going to be setting up a network support group to train network leaders and give them a tool kit to support them to set up a safe peer support group.

Talking therapies has been running a group session at OSM for 18 months or so. Funding has stopped and instead of the group stopping, two members of the group want it to keep going. Julie to supply a table for people to fill in a table of peer support that is available in Congleton. Supporting the support groups – best practice.

Social Prescribing model – but need to look at capability and capacity – need to make sure that you can do the right thing for people. (ANDY MILLS)

Living Well Website – need a more focussed approach for Congleton.

5 - Connected Communities - Mental Health is one of Congleton's Four Priorities

Explanation from Muka of Our Bright Idea – upto £10K – starting something new. Can be used for Capital and Revenue. My Bright Idea – upto £250 – don't need all the governance/constitution – can go to a personal bank account. £250 will be in front of a small panel – short presentation. Closing date is the 27th December, 27th March, 26th June, 25th September and 18th December.

Muka to come back about funding to promote Big Idea.
