Elizabeth Statue for Congleton

PLANS TO UNVEIL a life-size statue of Elizabeth Wolstenholme Elmy, a nationally recognised campaigner for women's, children and human rights, are on track for Tuesday 8th March, say the trustees of Elizabeth's Group. The statue will be unveiled in the pedestrian area on International Women's Day and follows four years of campaigning and fund raising by the volunteer Elizabeth's Group. The UK's most senior judge until her retirement last year, Lady Hale of Richmond, has agreed to unveil the statue to the remarkable Elizabeth, who lived in Congleton for most of her adult life and whose actions led to so many laws being changed to remove centuries of discrimination. The award-winning sculptor, Hazel Reeves, who made the statue will also be present. Plans for the day include a Victorian parade through the town starting at the top of Lawton Street to the statue, stalls and entertainment. The event is expected to last from 11am – 3pm with the unveiling at 2pm. For more details and

First Floor Town Centre Grants

CONGLETON TOWN COUNCIL has

approved £10,000 worth of grants to help spruce up spaces above shops and businesses in Congleton town centre. Landlords and business owners will be able to apply for up to £1,000 of match funding from the Town Council for works to improve the physical appearance to

the first-floor exterior. This is part of a drive from the Town Council to improve the attractiveness of the centre. It is expected that the scheme will be launched at the beginning of February, once the criteria has been approved by the Finance and Policy Committee. Stay Warm This Winter

CONCERNED about energy bills? You may be entitled to free advice via the Local Energy Advice Partnership (LEAP) Scheme, a free Energy and Money Saving Service, for our area. It offers eligible residents - owner



occupiers, private rented and social housing tenants - free advice and support to help them to save money and keep their homes warmer.

Via telephone interview, the LEAP Advisor can access funding for homeowners to replace broken boilers or towards first time central heating as well as other energy efficiency improvements. They can help check your energy bills, review how energy efficient your home is, give energy saving tips and devices. A free telephone advice service is also available to help with benefits, debt management and other money problems. Residents may gualify for the LEAP Service if one of the following apply - have a low income, receive tax credits or housing or disability related benefits or have a long-term illness or disability. COMMUNITY TAX

Congleton Town Council community tax will rise by £1.88 (2.07%) per year for a Band D property – or 3.6p per week from April 2022. Efforts were made to keep the increase as low as possible whilst still supporting events and improvements for 2022/23.

There are still funds available in the Town Council grants budget. Local groups and organisations need to apply via the Finance and Policy Committee. Last chance to apply for this financial year is 24th March – applications must be with the council by Tuesday 15th March.

THE CONGLETON TREE

GROUP has made great progress. Following the award of a Community Hedge Fund grant from the Tree Council, 28 volunteers with an age range of 7 to 75 have given almost 200 hours since late October to plant trees, new hedgerows and a new community orchard. The group has also been mulching and weeding at sites planted over the past two years.

Other volunteers have been busy at the Dane Valley Community Energy site at Havannah, planting oak (donated saplings), alder, hazel, rowan, holly and grey willow, plus hawthorn, blackthorn, elder and crab apple.

The group has plans to plant at several more sites up until the end of March. There will be some new orchards, hedges and tree whips to be planted and more volunteers are welcome and needed! Celebrate Congleton's 750 Charter Year

Did you know...

In the early 13th century Congleton belonged to the de Lacy family, in 1272 Henry de Lacy, 3rd Earl of Lincoln granted the town its first charter. The Charter enabled the town to hold fayres and markets, people were allowed to trade without tolls and taxes. It also gave the inhabitants of the town the right

to elect a Mayor, and an Ale Taster.

It gave men the right to hold land through the payment of rent rather than by personal service to the Lord of the Manor. The charter was presented to the then small community on the banks of the river Dane allowing the rights and dignities of a medieval township. Over 750 years the town has grown to 30,000 residents.

The Town Council is working with Congleton Community Projects developing an exciting calendar of Medieval themed events and activities throughout the year so that everyone living and working in Congleton can join together to celebrate our town, its history and all the many things that are special about Congleton.







Heraldic Flags & Mountbatten Way Banners

Town centre buildings will be adorned with 60 heraldic flags during the summer months. Led by Congleton Community Projects with support from local artists and the Electric Picture House, the flags have been individually created at a series of workshops. The project has been funded by a successful Heritage Lottery grant. Mountbatten Way and West Street roundabout area will be decorated with heraldic banners.
