
Congleton Park together with Town Wood - as a Historic England Grade 2 registered park with Local Wildlife Site this area should have its own management plan or plans.

NO MOW MAY

Congleton Streetscape Services provides the grounds maintenance for the parks and many of the green spaces in Congleton under contract to Cheshire East.

Cheshire East has reviewed its Municipal Parks Strategy and as part of the Climate and Nature emergency is encouraging NO MOW May. This also fits with the Town Council's green agenda. No Mow May is a national campaign to let more flowers bloom in May to support bees and other pollinators.

	Changing grass-cutting habits in May can create enough nectar for 10 times more bees and insects. This is critical for our rapidly depleting insect and bird populations.		
	Our parks and open spaces are valued in Congleton and used by hundreds of people. The current climate emergency presents the Council and the community with challenges that we cannot ignore. Our parks and open spaces are essential to helping us address the impact of global warming and take actions to take to tackle climate change head-on. Cheshire East and the Town Council need to make sure that our parks and open spaces are managed and maintained sustainably, and the Town Council intends to lead by example to influence positive change.		
	Congleton Town Council will be working with Cheshire East to adopt more sustainable methods of managing our open spaces. We are committed to making our approaches to the management and maintenance of the park and other areas more sustainable. This year we will be leaving some areas of the parks and open spaces unmown. This is a simple way to provide a more diverse landscape for wildlife such as birds, small mammals, and pollinating insects. In May 2022 we will only cut where it is needed on health and safety grounds or where we must cut under contract.		
Proposal	For the Community and Environment Committee to note the work on the site- specific biodiversity plan and to support Streetscape adopting the national No Mow May campaign where it is safe and possible to do so.		
Environmental	This paper is fundamentally about the Town Council's response to the Climate and Nature emergency and actions to encourage greater Biodiversity in Congleton.		
Equality	Tackling environmental issues is to the benefit of everyone. If the No Mow May has a detrimental impact on access for some community members, that area will be considered, and appropriate action is taken.

Background	Congleton Town Councillors have asked officers to investigate installing some 'Chatty Benches' in Congleton. 'Chatty Benches' have been added to in towns and villages across the UK. The idea is that you brand a bench with a plaque making it clear that people sitting on the bench are happy to talk. Cheshire East Ansa has recently installed four Happy to Talk benches across Cheshire East – in parks in Crewe, Macclesfield and Sandbach. Congleton Town Council Officers have assessed this as a relatively easy project which if councillors wanted could be installed in Congleton.
