

#### Time to take the promise

Dear Sir, — How time flies by.
Once again it is White Ribbon
day on Friday, 25th November.
The White Ribbon campaign is
about reducing the incidence of male violence towards women which remains at an unacceptable level in our society.

Congleton, as an accredited White Ribbon town, is committed to getting as many men and boys as possible to take the White Ribbon promise, to abide by it and to spread the message.

In addition to information stalls at various important events in the town, fellow White Ribbon ambassadors have done sterling work with various groups and, in particular, they have held several highly successful workshops in schools. It is particularly important to get young people debating the issue of respect between the genders given the negative effect often attributed to social media.

The White Ribbon promise is very simple, it is: "I promise to never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women."

I would ask men and boys to take this promise, to abide by it and to spread the message. They might even want to become a White Ribbon champion or ambassador. We really do need to make every day of the year a White Ribbon day. - Yours faithfully,

#### against women

Dear Sir, — Friday, 25th November marks White Ribbon day here in the UK, which is also the start of 16 days of action focusing on this national and non-political campaign.

This year, our campaign commences in the same week as the start of the FIFA men's World Cup and will highlight 11 traits men and boys can nurture to create a world of equality and safety for women.

It is astounding to know that domestic abuse goes up almost 20% after England has played football, and 50% if England

White Ribbon UK are part of a global movement to end male violence against women and girls and we do this by encouraging men and boys to take action to change the behaviour and culture that leads to violence and abuse.

I was moved to become a White Ribbon ambassador several years ago as I passionately believe in challenging violence against women and girls and promoting positive and respectful relationships between men and

I therefore took the White Ribbon promise to "never use. excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women".

Looking at my immediate family group, I could not stand idly by when one in three women experience domestic violence in their lifetime with over 80% being harassed in a public place.

All too often it is women who are wrongly told that they need to change if they don't want to be abused, bullied or harassed but White Ribbon UK recognises that it is men and boys who need to take action to stop this unacceptable behaviour.

We know not all men are abusive or violent, but we do all have a role to play in stopping gender-based violence which is why I made the White Ribbon promise and became a White Ribbon ambassador.




#### White Ribbon Conference

- A number of interesting talks including from Chief Constable Mark Roberts, survivors and former perpetrators of domestic abuse and sexual violence

- Mentell, the men's mental health charity, talked about their support groups, the challenges men face, and the importance of positive masculinity




## Congleton White Ribbon 2022 Videos

## myCWA 'Positive Masculinity' video




- myCWA is the service provider for domestic abuse in Cheshire East
