

Health and Wellbeing Fayre

CONGLETON TOWN HALL is the place to be on Tuesday 28 March. From 10am - 3pm more than 30 local organisations that provide health and/or wellbeing services within the Congleton community will be located in the town hall ready to meet you and see how they may be able to help. The event is open to all and free to enter, although best placed to help those aged over 50. Drop in when it suits you.

On the day there will be a 20-minute scam awareness course – helping to show you ways to protect yourself from scams and fraud. Last year in Cheshire, 5,281 people reported being scammed, costing them over £20 million. There will also be some defibrillator training, including basic life support.

Get Election Ready!

THURSDAY 4 MAY is local elections day! Voters in Congleton will elect 22 councillors to serve on Congleton Town Council and six councillors to serve on Cheshire East Council from May 2023 until May 2027. To vote you will need to be 18 and registered on the electoral roll.

Cheshire East Council maintains the electoral database. If you are new to the area or not registered you can register online at: **www.gov.uk/register-to-vote**. If you need a postal or proxy vote you can use the .gov website or email:

This year the government has ruled that everyone voting at the polling station must show original official photo ID, such as passport, driving licence, proof of age, blue badge scheme. Could you be a Councillor?

THIS MAY 'all-out' elections will take place at Congleton Town Council. Those wishing to stand have until 4pm on April 4 to get their completed application forms to Cheshire East Council (CEC). CEC will hold a briefing session for potential candidates in Congleton Town Hall on Thursday 2 March at 5.30pm for potential borough councillors and 7pm for town councillors. To stand as a councillor you must be over 18, live, work or own property in the town, or live within 3 miles of the boundary. You cannot be subject to bankruptcy or have been sentenced to at least 3 months in prison within 5 years of the election.

Candidates can represent a political party - you will need the formal backing of that party – or can stand as an independent. Once elected, the 22 town councillors will be expected to work together on policy and direction, attend regular meetings and make decisions on services and budgets, they may also be contacted by residents seeking help. A Recycling Centre for Congleton

MORETHAN 6,000 PEOPLE signed three petitions handed to Cheshire East Council demanding a new Household Waste and Recycling Centre for Congleton. Town Councillors remain united in their belief that the town needs its own site. Fly tipping in the area has quadrupled in

recent months, creating a danger to people and wildlife and significant costs to the taxpayer. Cheshire East Council has resolved to form a sub-group to investigate future household waste and recycling provision, with particular reference to Congleton and the surrounding areas.

Community Tax

CONGLETON TOWN COUNCIL'S

element of the annual Council Tax Charge (known as the Precept) will be £1,068,179 for the financial year 2023-24. This equates to £96.37 per year for a Band D property from April 2023, a rise of 3.65% from 2022-2023. Efforts were

Protecting Green Spaces in Congleton



Green Web Pages

THE UPDATED 'GREEN' PAGES on the town council's website now provide more green resources and signposting for residents and businesses. There are three new sections – Green Council, Green Living and Green Business. Take the FREE Sustainable Living in Congleton e-learning course, to discover more ways to reduce your own carbon footprint (click the QR code).



ACCELERATING CLIMATE CHANGE means that it is no longer acceptable to wage war on the natural world with herbicides, pesticides and wall-to-wall mowing. As part of the climate and nature emergency Congleton Town Council commissioned work to create plans to improve the biodiversity of 30 green spaces in Congleton.

The 30 sites have been evaluated and appropriate improvements suggested, which will be subject to consultation and funding. The initial focus will be on Quinta Park, Back Lane, Stirling Close, land off Hillfields Close, Redfern Avenue, Windsor Place and Blackshaw Close. The Biodiversity improvement project will be launched at Stirling Close at 11am on 6 April.

Staff will be available to explain more about the sites and for those wanting to get more involved there will be a chance to learn about hedge planting, tree planting and maintaining green spaces. All the plans can be seen on the biodiversity pages of the town council website and we would welcome your feedback and help with these important projects.



CONGLETON TOWN COUNCIL is adopting a low-mow town approach to grass cutting and is encouraging other organisations to do the same. The low mow approach will be an all year round campaign which will see more swathes of land left completely unmown during the growing season to enable nature to thrive,

whilst some areas will be cut less frequently.

The Low Mow approach has evolved from experience, and the council believes it will be better for wildlife - especially frogs and dormice, better for the equipment and will lead to less issues around mess. The approach will see more areas left wild until the end of the season.

whilst regularly used areas are kept trimmed. Mowing schedules will vary from area to area, with all areas being left at the beginning of May. Where grass is cut less often, the town council's Streetscape service will still visit to maintain the area. At the end of the growing season all areas will be cut to prepare for the next season.

Fight against Fly-Tippers

ILLEGAL FLY-TIPPERS will be 'caught on camera' in a new initiative by Cheshire East Council (CEC) and Congleton Town Council. Portable CCTV cameras will be used at fly-tipping hotspots around Congleton and the surrounding countryside to help identify offenders. The footage will be used as evidence and to identify vehicles or individuals present who may have useful information. Fly-tipping is a criminal offence

with maximum fines of £50,000, or a 12-month prison

If you are aware of fly-tipping, please report it via Fix my Street or phone CEC on 0300 123 5011. Leaving unauthorised bags by recycling, cloth or public bins is classed as fly tipping. Last year the cost of clearing up fly-tipping in Congleton was £12.000.





Tree Planting

THE TREES FOR CONGLETON GROUP

was delighted to receive lots of positive support for its tree and hedge planting plans during recent consultation. An initial nine Congleton sites were identified for planting in 2022-23, using funding from the Tree Council. These are at Back Lane, Hertford Close, Lambert's Lane Water Tower, Pirie Road, Quayside / St Peters Rd, Quinta Park, Havannah Lane – St Johns Rd, Solly Crescent and Thirlmere Court. Plans and planting dates can be viewed online.

The volunteer group, under the umbrella of Congleton Sustainability Group, is on track to plant 30,000 trees in Congleton by the end of 2024. The group is grateful to everyone for their help, particularly the young planters getting involved as well as businesses and organisations expressing an interest.
