	If another authority has a statutory duty to provide a service (e.g. education) it remains their duty to provide it but the Town Council may assist. The Council needs to ask itself whether an individual, private company or community trust could help, if the answer is yes, then the Council can assist. An appropriate delivery body may need to be set up to do so. If the action the Council wishes to take is also covered by a specific power then any restrictions that apply to the overlapping power remain in place. So, if existing legislation requires the Council to seek permission before acting, then it must do so. For example, the council asks permission of the	
	Highways Authority before doing work on roadside verges. The conditions for eligibility are set out in the Statutory Instrument, Parish	
Eligibility	<ul> <li>Councils (General Power of Competence) (Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012.</li> <li>The Council must decide its eligibility at a Full Council Meeting through the recording of a proper minute; eligibility must then be confirmed at the annual meeting following ordinary elections for as long as the Council wishes to continue using the power.</li> <li>Eligibility Criteria: <ul> <li>i. the Chief Officer is qualified to one of the two sector-specific qualifications and has upgraded those qualifications to cover the General Power of Competence and</li> <li>ii. two-thirds of the Council has stood for election.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The Council meets both of these criteria. In the recent 4<sup>th</sup> May 2023 Elections all 22 Councillors stood for election.</li> </ul>
