INDEPENDENT TRADERS across Congleton are getting together to have some fun, help market each other and make Congleton that little bit better for all!

Adopting the grassroots 'Totally Locally' campaign, the businesses will be championing independent shops and market stall retailers. Look out for offers like the 'Totally Tenner Wednesdays' and the 'Fiver Fest'. The numbers soon add up! If 15,000 adults in Congleton redirected £10 that they may spend online or at a multi-national supermarket to an independent shop or business, it would be worth £7.8 million to our high street. This means more quality local jobs and more money being retained within the local economy (independents tend to buy locally and recruit locally). Look out for Totally Locally signage across Congleton and in the new Congleton Market Quarter!

Have your say on Car Parking in Congleton

CONGLETON RESIDENTS have until Wednesday 1 November to have their say on the Cheshire East Consultation into Parking Charges. Cheshire East Council is proposing to make the following changes:

- Overall price increases to hourly rates and quarterly and annual permits
- Increase the chargeable times from 9am-5pm to 8am-6pm
- Parking will still be free on a Sunday



The consultation is available online or you can make an appointment to view the proposals at Congleton Library. Pre-consultation Congleton Town Council informed Cheshire East it thought Congleton Town Centre was not in a position to accept higher charges. There are no demand and supply issues, and rather than saving carbon the increase could mean that people drive to other shopping areas with free parking, to the detriment of the town centre. It is important that everyone can enjoy our town and feel welcomed and valued. By identifying the obstacles, we can attempt to address them to try and make the town more accessible. We appreciate that we will not be able to sort everything, and infrastructure projects can be years in the making and funding is not always easy to gain – but we will listen, and we will do what we can. Earlier this year an inclusive roundabout was added to the park playground following a request from a parent with a child who uses a wheelchair – so change can happen! Planting and Caring for Trees

CONGLETON BENEFITS greatly from historic trees including ancient woodland in the Dane Valley, and mature trees originating from lost country houses and farmland.



If you have trees on your land, historic or otherwise, protect them and allow them to grow naturally so that they can continue to fix carbon, provide valuable wildlife habitat, and enrich everyone's lives for as long as possible. Looking to the future, increasingly threatened by climate change, the Trees for Congleton group is over halfway towards its goal of planting 30,000 young native trees, woody shrubs, hedging plants and fruit trees, one for each of the town's 30,000 or so residents. As it matures, this planting will capture carbon, provide some resilience against climate change and boost biodiversity. Be a Good Neighbour this Winter

AS THE WEATHER TURNS COLDER, spare a thought and a little time for your neighbours. They may need your help, especially if they are elderly, disabled or have a chronic illness.

Here's a few tips to being a good neighbour this winter:

- Check on elderly neighbours or relatives to make sure they are safe and well. A phone call or a knock at the door can make all the difference and can brighten their day
- Make sure they have enough food and medicines to prevent them having to go out in very cold or icy weather
- Give your phone number to elderly neighbours so they can contact you for help if they are unwell or had a fall
- Is their house warm enough? Ideally living rooms should be heated to 21°C and bedrooms to 18°C
- Keep drives and footpaths clear of snow and ice for your neighbours. Advice is available from: www.gov.uk/clear-snow-road-path-cycleway

Hollie Guard – Protecting You

HOLLIE GUARD can be downloaded for free from Google Play or the App Store. It enables anyone feeling threatened to press a panic button on their phone to automatically alert their chosen contacts, which allows them to see where the person is and hear what is happening (providing privacy settings have been activated).

If you are concerned about where you are going, you can programme an alert to be raised if you don't arrive at your set destination by a given time. A paid version of Hollie Guard Extra will link 24/7 to a police-approved response centre.

Be Drink Aware



ALCOHOL is having a serious effect on some people in Congleton. Alcohol can lower your energy, lead to relationship problems, depression, insomnia, impotence, injury, high blood pressure, alcohol dependence, liver disease and breast, mouth, and throat cancers. There is no completely safe limit, but it is advised that adults do not drink more than 14 units a week, spread evenly over three days, give your body a break and try and have several 'drink free' days. 
