Congleton War Memorial Hospital Celebrates 100 years!

CONGLETON WAR MEMORIAL is celebrating 100 years of service to the people of Congleton! The hospital was built in 1924 and paid for by local people as a memorial to the 243 killed in the First World War. It was opened by HRH Duke of York (later King George VI) who said: "The hospital will always be a reminder to generations to come of the prudent and generous instincts of the townspeople of Congleton, and it is my earnest hope that it may be regarded by those who will follow in your footsteps as an inspiration."

Until the National Health Service was formed in 1948 the hospital was funded by every worker in Congleton contributing 1d. per week (30p in today's money), an annual hospital carnival, private subscriptions, bequests and other fundraising.

The hospital remains an essential part of Congleton. East Cheshire NHS Trust is keen to promote the past, present and future use of the hospital and is encouraging local people to send their memories of the hospital to: **ecntstaff.comms@nhs.net** to create an online portal. Congleton Town Council is investigating hosting a 1920s style event in the park on 27 May to celebrate.

Community Grants up for Grabs!

The grant applications are considered at the Finance & Policy Committee meetings, which take place every 6-8 weeks. The upcoming meeting on 14 March 2024, will determine the allocation of the remaining funds for 2023/2024. If your application is for a cultural, environmental or educational project in Congleton you should also consider the *Margaret Williamson Trust*. This allocates grants once a year, and is open for applications from **14 February until 18 March**. Funding decisions will be made by the end of March. The fund was set up in memory of Margaret Williamson OBE who was committed to improving culture, environmental and education opportunities in the town. The funds allocated will be the interest on the capital, expected to be around £4,000.

It suggested imposing fees for parking on Roe Street (Lawton House Surgery car park) and in towns that currently offer free parking. Cheshire East will be discussing the price rises at its Highways and Transport Committee on 25 January. The Town Council thanks all those residents who responded to this consultation and hopes that the suggestions and objections made by us all will be heard



£5m Diagnostic Centre coming to Congleton

IN THE YEAR THAT WE CELEBRATE 100 YEARS OF THE WAR MEMORIAL

HOSPITAL (WMH), it is a massive credit to the Cheshire East NHS Trust that it has secured £5 million for a new community diagnostic centre to be built on the hospital site.

Congleton will house one of only four new centres in England and the services will be a great benefit for residents.

The diagnostic centre will provide multiple additional screening rooms in addition to associated patient waiting facilities, toilets and other amenities.

Diagnostic services delivered from Congleton hospital will focus on Imaging, X-ray and Non-Obstetric Ultrasound (NOUS), and Cardio-Respiratory physiological testing such as Electrocardiography (ECG), Echocardiograms and other physiological tests. This means local people can be tested closer to home.

According to NHS England, more than 85% of patients seeking NHS care require diagnostics. Prompt diagnosis can save lives and drastically improve patient outcomes.

Planning permission is being sought from Cheshire East Council and it is anticipated that the new centre will be in operation in 2025.



Sowing the seeds of Community

CONGLETON TOWN COUNCIL and Congleton Rotary have joined forces to cultivate a sense of community through the innovative Community Garden Stall. This initiative not only aims to enhance the town's green spaces but also promotes sustainability and a spirit of sharing among residents.

The stall, located in Congleton Park, will operate from February to November, Monday-Friday from 8am-3pm, offering free garden pots, tools, produce, and plants. Embracing the principles of reuse and recycling, people can take what they need and contribute any surplus gardening items they may have. Residents are encouraged to show their support to help turn the stall into a flourishing hub. Look out for Rotary's Wildlife Friendly Garden competition running June-August.



Fostering Biodiversity

ENHANCING THE ENVIRONMENT between people and nature is at the forefront of the town council's biodiversity plans. The council is actively expanding green sites across Congleton, encouraging individuals to participate in a greener future. Residents can engage in activities such as hedge planting, tree planting, and the upkeep of green spaces.
