The event is **inclusive for all**, with a quiet zone in **The Space** kindly supported by TMC, accessible toilet facilities in the Town Hall, portable toilets on Market Street and on-site first aid throughout the day.

Congleton Pride is back on **Saturday 19 July**, with a free, family-friendly event in the town centre. **The festivities begin at 10am** with a bustling Artisan Market in the covered Market Area (by Morrisons), running until 4pm, alongside events in the Market Quarter continuing into the evening.

The vibrant **Pride Parade** sets off from West Street car park at **11.30am**, reaching the main stage at noon, where an exciting entertainment lineup will run until 5pm. From 12–4pm, the **High Street** will feature volunteer and charity stalls, the Beartown Bar, food vendors, and a covered seating area. Meanwhile, **Bridge Street** will host a **Community Stage** (12–5pm) and a Children's Play Day with circus skills and art workshops (12–4pm). Congleton Pride promises a fantastic day for all. #### The Countdown to Summer is On



Congleton Paddling Pool will officially open on **Saturday 24 May**. Visitors can look forward to cooling off and enjoying this much-loved community facility. The pool will be open daily during school holidays until Sunday 31 August, with **two sessions from 10am-1pm and 2pm-5pm**. The

pool will be closed on Monday and Tuesday during term time. No booking is required, but entry will be managed on a first-come, first-served basis, with a maximum capacity of 140 people per session. Once this limit is reached, visitors will need to wait until space becomes available. The pool may close on cold or wet days. #### **News in Brief**

Parking fee changes at Cheshire East car parks will take effect in May. Changes include extended charging hours (8am-10pm), Sunday charges based on weekday rates, a new 14-hour tariff, and increased fees for some permits. Updates will be displayed in car parks and on: www.cheshireeast.gov.uk. Congleton Town Council strongly opposed the proposals in its written response to Cheshire East Council in October 2024. This stance was echoed by approximately 96% of residents who responded to the public consultation, expressing their objection to the increased charges.

#### "Devolution and what it means

for you" Residents in Cheshire and Warrington have voiced their opinions on proposed changes to local democracy. A government consultation on the devolution deal closed on 13 April, with a decision pending. If approved, a new mayoral combined authority (CA) would be created, existing councils in Cheshire East, Cheshire West, and Warrington would be retained. #### **Drug Testing Kits launched to Combat Spiking**



Congleton Town Council, in collaboration with Congleton Police and funding from the Cheshire Police & Crime Commissioner's Safety, Working Together, Action and Prevention (SWAP) fund, has introduced drug testing kits in local venues to **support potential spiking victims**.

WHITE RIBBON ACCREDITED WORKING TOGETHER TO END MEN'S VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN The recently launched initiative, was developed with input from the town council's White Ribbon group and the Community Safety group.

Hospitality venues across Congleton now have drug testing kits behind the bar for individuals who suspect they or someone they know has been spiked. Costa Coffee locations across the town, also offer these kits, as they open earlier than most venues.

Unlike hospitals, which typically test for only two substances, these kits detect 13 common drugs. Victims can provide a urine sample and check the results within 60 minutes. **Spiking is a serious offence**, carrying up to 10 years imprisonment, and victims are encouraged to seek support and report incidents to the police immediately.

#### **Accessible Scheme Opens Doors**

A Disability Welcome Scheme has been launched by the town council to help local shops and businesses **improve accessibility** for disabled visitors. A survey by the council's Equal Access Advisory Group found that 87% of disabled respondents faced challenges in the town centre, and over 50% felt businesses were not well informed about their needs. The group, made up of local people with lived experience, helped create a checklist of simple measures businesses can take, such as large-print pricing, clear aisles, temporary ramps, and staff training.



Businesses meeting the checklist requirements will receive a '**Disability Welcome**' window sticker, certificate, and inclusion in a planned Disability Guide to Congleton. All businesses with a shop front are encouraged to apply. #### Have Your Say at the Annual Town Meeting

Before the meeting, the **Town Mayor's Civic Awards** will celebrate outstanding volunteers, with winners announced and presented on the night. #### **Congleton to Welcome New Mayor**

Congleton Town Councillors will elect a new mayor at a public ceremony in the Town Hall on **22 May, 7pm**. The incoming mayor will make their official pledge, and outline their plans for the year ahead. The celebrations will continue on **22 June**, with the **Mayor's Parade and Civic Service**, at **St Peter's Church, 3pm** offering the wider community an opportunity to take part in this civic tradition.

#### Trees for Congleton Exceed 30,000 Tree Goal

The group have surpassed their ambitious goal of planting 30,000 trees, one for every resident, since launching in 2019. Formed after the town council declared a climate emergency, the volunteer group has worked tirelessly over six years despite COVID delays.

With support from Cheshire Wildlife Trust, Congleton Partnership, and other funders, hundreds of school children, residents, and businesses have planted trees, hedges, and over 25 orchards, enriching biodiversity. The group has also led planting projects celebrating the late Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the King's Coronation, and Congleton War Memorial Hospital's Centenary.

March saw nearly 100 schoolchildren plant Cheshire East's first tiny forest, learning about tree species and habitats. Recent projects include a community orchard at Astbury Mere, 250 hedge plants at Black Firs School (pictured), and planting efforts by Buglawton in Bloom, Kanga, and TMC. Leaving a lasting green legacy for future generations.

To mark this remarkable milestone the group would like to invite all its volunteers to a special event unveiling a plaque for the 30,000th tree at Hankinson's field on 9 May at 4pm.



#### **In Bloom Going for Gold**

Congleton will proudly represent the North West in the 2025 RHS Britain in Bloom UK Finals, competing in the Best Overall Large Town category. Aiming for its fifth Gold, the town will be judged on 24 July for North West in Bloom and 7 August for Britain in Bloom. This year's theme highlights the connection between people, plants, and mental health. Look out for the Flower Finding Trail this



summer - search for clues in shop windows and collect a free seed planting kit at the end! Congleton in Bloom's success is a true team effort, with volunteers, community partners, and the Streetscape team. #### Whole Housing Approach to Domestic Abuse

The Whole Housing Approach (WHA) pilot has transformed how housing and domestic abuse services collaborate to support survivors.
