BACKGROUND	Domestic and sexual violence are among the most prevalent violent crimes in Cheshire East and Congleton, and a high priority for Cheshire Constabulary and Cheshire East Council. In Congleton an incident of Domestic Abuse is reported to the Police every day, on average. There is a Domestic Abuse Helpline available to Congleton Residents (0300 123		
	5101) and a Survivors' Peer Support Group provided by myCWA meets monthly in Congleton.		
CURRENT SITUATION	The Cheshire East Domestic and Sexual Abuse Partnership Board (CEDSAP) has been working on a new Domestic Abuse Strategy for Cheshire East and this is now out for Consultation until 25th July.
